1. CMA Update:

- The CMA's waiver's are being redeveloped/ changed in July 2025.
 - o There are no service changes that should affect member's services
 - CFC is going into affect, lower tier services for members or services fall under the current HCBS waiver.
 - Nurse assessor's will be completing a portion of what we do for members who will be the individual's who assess for particular criteria portions of what a member needs are.
- Caseload count for all waivers and programs: 1,550 individuals served.
 - Referrals continue to come in at volume

IV. Review of Complaints/Trends

- 8 complaint has been recorded for the last quarter (March-May).
 - In March & April, we had 2 guardians inquire about when FSSP checks would be issued/ when ready.
 - CM explained process of how once the invoices are received, they are submitted to State, after state issues us the requested amount, then NECALG can issue the checks.

- March complaints were closed. NECALG
 does re-explain process to FSSP members at
 great length upon applying as well as
 explain process each month when guardians
 inquire about status.
- In April, the provider was concerned that Member was having homemaker go to the member's mother's house to provide homemaking services, which mother is not a member.
 - Provider discussed with member that only services can be provided at Member's residency and not the mothers.
 - CM had reached out to Member and discussed that services are only authorized at the member's residency
 - CM and Provider agreed that if member requests provider to go to the mother's residency then she would confirm no further items need to be completed at member's residency and leave if none.
- V. At this time, no further reports of this being completed but is being monitored
 - CM received complaint that a provider was billing units while a member was sleeping.
 - CM explained that billable services are tasks being completed for members needs and while individual is sleeping/ tasks aren't being completed doesn't meant billable criteria.
 - Complaint resolved.
